QUALITY EDUCATION

School Education (Primary and Secondary)

The Australian schools are ranked as some of the finest in the world.

Australian public schools are free to attend for Australian citizens and permanent residents, while non-government schools (including faith-based schools and schools founded on educational philosophies) and other independent schools usually charge attendance fees. Public and private schools are all subject to strict government controls and regulations to maintain the highest standards.

The school year runs from January to December.

School education (primary and secondary) is compulsory between the ages of six and sixteen (Year 1 to Year 9 or 10). School education is similar across all states and territories with only minor variations with all Australian schools being required to adhere to the same curriculum frameworks of their state or territory.

The 13 years of school education is divided into:

Primary school - seven years, starting at Kindergarten Preparatory through to Year 6.

Secondary school - four years, from Years 7 to 10.

Senior

secondary school - two years, Years 11 and 12.

Some of the characteristics that make Australian school education so valuable includes:

- Small class sizes with a maximum of 30 students in a class
- Qualified and university-trained teachers who specialise in subject areas
- Superior facilities
- Quality assurance frameworks where schools must meet required standards



Tertiary Education

Tertiary education includes both higher education (including universities) and vocational education and training (VET) which includes Technical and Further Education (TAFEs) - the largest education and training sector in Australia.

Vocational education and training providers are registered and regulated by the Australian Skills Quality Agency (ASQA).

The Australian education system is distinguished from many other countries by the Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF). The AQF was established in 1995 and is a national policy that covers qualifications from the tertiary education sector (higher education and vocational education and training) in addition to the school-leaving; the Senior Secondary Certificate of Education.

Australia's universities rank as some of the best in the world. The country boasts 40 public universities, two international universities and one private university.

University tuition fees are calculated based on the calendar year of study, the selected course, and government funding arrangements. Most domestic undergraduate students who are Australian citizens or are permanent residents are eligible for Commonwealth Supported Place (CSP) in their course.

A Commonwealth Supported Place (CSP) is a place at a university or higher education provider where the government subsidises part of the fees. The remaining portion is called the 'student contribution amount', the payment of which the student is liable.

Commonwealth Supported Places (CSP) are available at all public universities in Australia and some, but not all, private institutions.





SAFE AND AFFORDABLE HEALTHCARE

Australia's healthcare system is one of the best in the world, recently ranking an impressive third among eleven of the world's wealthiest countries*. The quality of healthcare is one of the key reasons why Australians enjoy one of the longest life expectancies!

The Australian healthcare system provides a wide range of services – from general and preventative health through to more complex specialist or hospital care.

It is divided into two major parts – the public health system (Medicare – funded by tax) and the private health system. Access to healthcare can be through either one or a combination of both systems.

Medicare and the public hospital system provide quality free or low-cost access for all Australians to most of these health care services. Private health insurance gives you choice outside the public system. For private health care both in and out of hospital, you contribute towards the cost of your health care.

Medicare has been Australia's universal health care scheme since 1984. Its 3 major components include:

- medical services
- public hospitals
- medicines

Medicare is available to Australian and New Zealand citizens as well as permanent residents in Australia.

THE STATES AND PROVINCES OF AUSTRALIA

Australia, officially the Commonwealth of Australia, is a sovereign country comprising the mainland of the Australian continent, the island of Tasmania, and numerous smaller islands.

Australia is the smallest of the world's continents – it comprises a land area of approximately 7.692 million square kilometres. Although this is just 5% of the world's land mass, Australia is the planet's sixth largest country by area in Oceania and the world's sixth-largest country.

Australia's land mass is:

- •almost as great as that of the United States of America
- •about 50 per cent greater than Europe, and
- •32 times greater than the United Kingdom.

Nearly 20% of Australia's land mass is classified as desert. Climatic zones range from tropical rainforests, deserts, and cool temperature forests to snow-capped mountains.

Australia is home to sprawling modern cities, unique wildlife, vast countryside, and some of the most spectacular beaches in the world.

Canberra is the national capital of Australia.

The country is divided into six states and two territories – each of which have their own unique blend of beauty, cultures, and opportunities.

The largest community of South Africans live in Sydney followed closely by Perth and then Melbourne.





Not all migration professionals offer services or expertise in this important area. Resident Return Visas (RRV's) are really extensions of migrant visas, typically issued to people who are permanent residents or who were previously permanent residents and not yet citizens of Australia and need to travel or remain overseas, in the medium term.
